Description

Two beautiful coffee cups with their saucers in Paris porcelain, by Jean-Pierre Feuillet (unsigned), manufacture of the rue de la Paix, Rihouet Adorned with flowers in its foliage, floral cartouches on a green background embellished with typical golden scrolls of the porcelain decorator Jean-Pierre Feuillet. Son of the Prince de Condé's pastry chef, Jean-Pierre Feuillet (1777-1840) learned to paint at the school founded by the Prince in his chateau near Paris, at Chantilly. On July 20, 1814, during the Bourbon Restoration, Feuillet moved to Paris as one of the first porcelain decorators in the rue de la Paix, under the protection of the prince. Feuillet acquired the reputation of being one of the best porcelain decorators in the capital. Its suppliers of white porcelain were always of high quality, with
